It wasn't until the passing of her daughter 9 years ago and her mother's suffering from depression that she decided to delve into mental health. She enjoys being able to help individuals with mental health disorders and seeing their progression with adequate treatment. "Mental health is so passionate and personal to me." Owusu stated. Health care is a continuously changing environment. Healthcare professionals witness growing numbers of patients with diverse cultural backgrounds. Elizabeth knows that understanding patients' needs is key to reducing disparities which adversely increases patient satisfaction. "The more satisfied my patients are, the more I feel accomplished.
